Two of Botswana's iconic lodges have been reborn—and they're more eco-friendly than ever.

Wilderness Safaris is just wrapping its nine-month rebuild of **Mombo** and **Little Mombo**, the company's flagship properties in Botswana's Moremi Game Reserve, with an eye toward ethical tourism. The new tents were constructed with salvaged materials on the same footprint as that of their predecessors to limit disturbance to the environment, and both camps are entirely solar-powered. Some things, though, haven't changed—guests will still be able to enjoy spa treatments, alfresco dinners in the central boma, and the best wildlife spotting in the region. wilderness-safaris.com; doubles from \$1,892 per person.

Hollywood's favorite boot camp will soon whip you into shape in Italy.

A peculiar mansion in northern California is getting its star turn.

Head to the movie theater on February 2 to see Helen Mirren and Jason Clarke headline in *Winchester*, a creepy flick about the eccentric San Jose, California, heiress to the Winchester fortune who spent almost 40 years renovating her home to add hidden rooms, stairways to nowhere, and secret passages in an effort to silence the spirits of those killed with the rifles that bore her name.
